## Criteria for the Provision of Second Wheelchairs

## Version 23.7.2014

In general, the Scottish Wheelchair Service aims to meet the primary clinical, social, and mobility needs of its patients with one wheelchair.

Exceptions to this rule are made for a small proportion of patients where there is a specific need for a second wheelchair. The large majority of these exceptions relate to the provision of a basic manual wheelchair as a back up to a powered wheelchair. Other examples include patients who have a second floor of their residence which is inaccessible and may receive a basic manual wheelchair for use upstairs.

The second wheelchair is considered of secondary importance and is of a more basic and simpler type than the primary issue.

## **Exclusion**

Wheelchairs required specifically for use in educational or vocational establishments are considered to be the responsibility of the relevant establishment.
